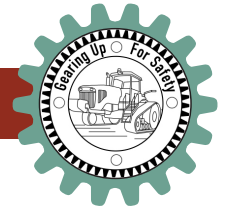


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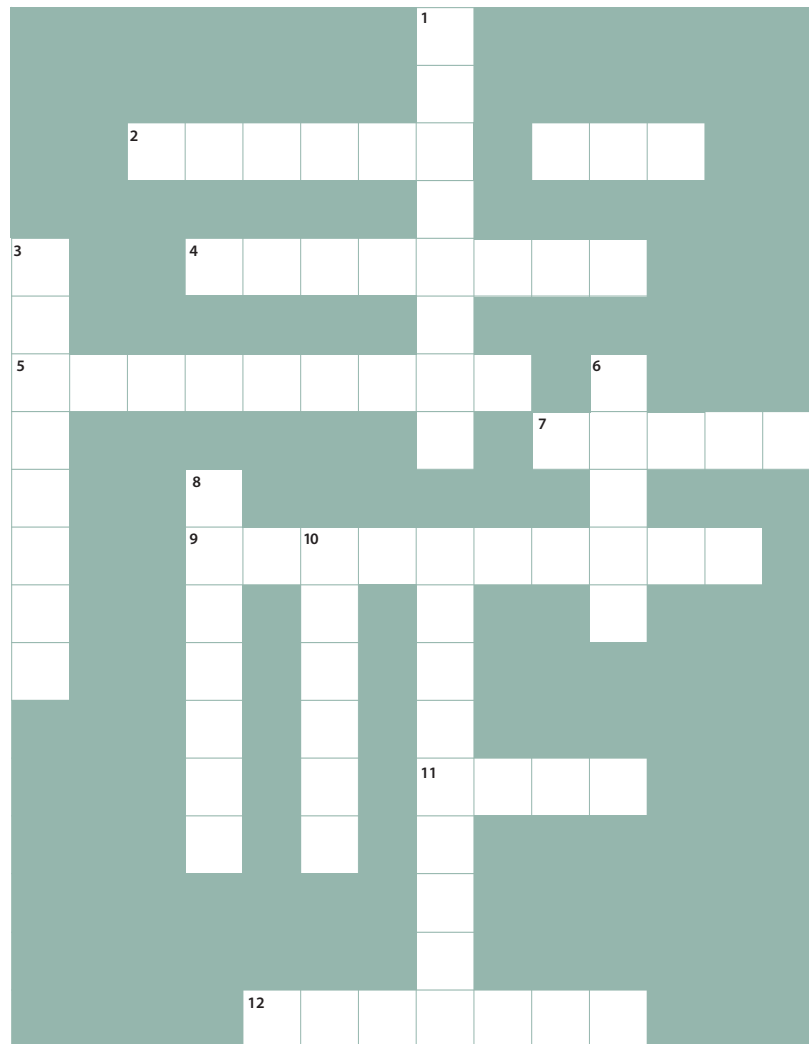


ACTIVITY WORKSHEET 15.1

ACROSS

- Extremely toxic atmosphere where animal waste is stored
- Pulling or dragging logs or trees to a central location using a tractor, or bulldozer
- Removing grain or logs from transport vehicle
- Especially common when working with cattle, horses, ostriches and llamas
- Completely buried in flowing grain
- A hazard found in this tall structure includes a lack of oxygen during fermentation
- Process of sawing a felled tree into sections or logs

DOWN

- Includes bulls, boars, sows with young, stallions
- Type of hazard when someone is pinned to the wall or ground by a heavy object
- These may be a source of disease transfer such as rabies
- Cutting a tree down so that it falls in the desired location
- Dehorning is done to reduce this risk
