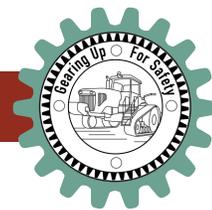

- When working with the lift arms of a skid-steer in the raised position, the most important thing the operator can do is:

 - Engage the mechanical lock for the hydraulic arm cylinders
 - Remove all attachments
- When loading a skid-steer loader for transport, you should:
 - Drive forward onto the trailer

 - Stage the trailer on a hill
- Extending the boom on a telehandler:
 - Enables the telehandler to carry a heavier load
