### **Appointments at Purdue University in the College of Agriculture:**

Dr. Russell was appointed Professor and Head of the Department of Youth Development and Agricultural Education in 2015. In addition to serving in his administrative position, he continues to focus on international education, community engagement and development using service-learning pedagogies. Previously, Dr. Russell held an 80% teaching appointment with a 20% Extension appointment in Animal Sciences. His career began at Illinois in 1975 (100% Extension) and at Purdue in 1982 with a 80% Extension and 20% teaching appointment.

### **Engagement/Extension**

Since 1982 Dr. Russell has provided a positive impression of Purdue Animal Sciences to the approximate 35,000 horse-owning operations and supporting industry agribusinesses and organizations in Indiana. This is an audience that often has had no other contact with Purdue Extension and Purdue University. Dr. Russell was asked to be the Purdue Animal Sciences Extension Coordinator because of his relationships and network with high school teachers, county educators, and industry leaders. Many of the programs he initiated in earlier years are now accepted annual events. As a result of his expertise in horse nutritional management and horse kinesiology, he has given 250 invited talks and judged over 1100 horse shows for various national breed associations in 14 countries.

Dr. Russell has focused more on the effective use of horses to benefit youth and society through serving a growing therapeutic horseback riding and driving industry and other human development efforts with horses. Even within Extension circles, his focus has shifted to increased emphasis on leadership development, problem solving skills, and multicultural and international approaches to serving our State and nation. As a result of his aggressive leadership, Purdue University is looked to as a source of information and leadership for the industry in Indiana and nationally. The demand for his time and expertise in Indiana and across the country is a tribute to his national recognition as an authority in this field. Dr. Russell was promoted to Associate and then to Full Professor with a majority Extension appointment. He has changed the way state Extension programs in the horse discipline collaborate and share resources. His Animal Sciences Extension responsibilities ended in 2015.

### **Teaching:**

Dr. Russell's goal is to strengthen the undergraduate and graduate curriculum with intercultural effectiveness skills of critical thinking, communication, and empathy and teamwork to ensure with breadth and depth of knowledge, skills, and practices that contribute to professional careers and communities. Dr. Russell has further sought opportunities to attract and motivate students through their interest in agriculture, food, and natural resources to further expand their personal comfort zone and learn about international cultures and difference worldviews. While in Animal Sciences, Dr. Russell designed and taught ANSC 440 Horse Management, ANSC 372 Horse Evaluation and ANSC 472 Horse Judging Team, co-developed the "81 Leadership Continuum" (ANSC 18100, 2811, 381, and 481), ANSC 393 Spring Break Animal Industry Tour, ANSC 201 Functional Anatomy and Animal Performance, ANSC 294-Exploring International Animal Agriculture, Maymester in China, Czech Republic, Ecuador, Hungary, Poland, Romania, and Slovakia, ANSC 494-Animals & Food Security: International Service Learning Maymester in selected villages with students of Banat University of Veterinary Medicine and Agricultural Sciences, Timisoara, Romania, and ANSC 10200, Introduction to Animal Sciences until changing roles in 2015.

### **Currently teaching or co-teaching the following courses:**

AGR 12100 - Orientation to Agricultural Communication and Agricultural Education, Fall sem. 25-35 students. 2015-present. An introduction to the academic programs offered in the Department of ASEC. Includes plans of study, courses, experiential programs, internships, student organizations, career opportunities, academic policies, scholarships, and student services.

ASEC 43100, 43110, & 43120 - International Engagement Methods-Service-Learning in Haiti, Winter, 18-20 students, 2011-present. Using established relationships (8 cohorts), students and live in Cap Haitien and work with Haitian partners and students to learn the principles of extension methodology, community development, and how to most effectively work with local leaders. Students learn the intercultural communication, entrepreneurial business planning, and cultural factors affecting leadership of community food security. Diverted in 2019-2020 to Peru due to US State Dept. Advisory Alert Level 3.

ASEC 43100 & 43110 - International Engagement Methods-Communities in Peru, Spring, 20 students, 2016, 2018. Students visit multiple locations in different environmental zones of Peru where they work in small teams with Peruvian students to conduct self-directed ethnographic studies that explore the numerous cultural and leadership factors that influence human practices in these settings.

ASEC 49100 - Peace Corps Prep: Intercultural Effectiveness Competencies, Fall, 5-12 students, 2017-present. Participants in this course will develop their intercultural knowledge, skills, and attitudes through dimensions of self-awareness, awareness of others, emotional resilience, and bridging cultural differences in international work. The goals of the course are to build the capacity to shift perspective and behavior around relevant cultural differences and to prepare students for volunteer service in international development.

ASEC 55100 - International Engagement & Development Strategies, Spring sem. 12-15 students, 2016-present A graduate-level overview of cross-disciplinary, cultural, theoretical frameworks, communication tools, and assessment methods applied to international agricultural development and engagement.

ASEC 59000 - Global Learning for Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources, Spring sem. 5-8 students, 2017-present. A graduate-level seminar in which students research, design, and evaluate communication and education methods and theoretical frameworks to apply appropriate cultural, community engagement, targeted outcomes of a population defined by the student.

He previously served as academic advisor for approximately 65-70 ANSC students each semester, 1996-2015. 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Dr. Russell, along with Dr. Jerry Peters, has hosted visiting scholar-PhD students from the Institute of Agricultural Extension and Rural Development, University of Agriculture, Faisalabad, Pakistan who studied the attitudes and behaviors of vegetable growers relative to urban markets and climate change as these factors impact effective Extension systems and engagement methods in many provinces of Pakistan.

#### International Education Engagement & Programs:

- Hosted, with Dr. Linda Pfeiffer, a visiting undergraduate intern from Panamerican Agricultural Zamorano University, Tegucigalpa, Honduras researching environmental science communication
- LASER PULSE relationships with Caribbean universities (University of the West Indies and the Université d'État d'Haïti) and the USAID/Lab Cultural Restoration Program for Northern Iraq as well as NIFA HEC and REEU project proposals.
- In response to high school administration requests throughout Haiti, Dr. Russell led two agricultural education trips in 2018 to visit with science teachers and principals to design inquiry and active learning curricula to teach STEM subjects with AFNR contexts. This demand is growing and Russell has coordinated independent study projects for Purdue students to design modules that are being used in Ganthier, Grand Riviere, and Limonade, Haiti.
- Dr. Russell led (May 2018) a multi-university team of faculty from University of North Carolina-Greensboro, University of Georgia, and Purdue University to Romania to renew relationships with the Universitatea Babeş-Bolyai, the Universitatea de Ştiinţe Agricole şi Medicină Veterinară of Cluj-Napoca and Timisoara, and the Open Fields NGO. This resulted in updated MOUs and a partnership in the Erasmus+ program and hopefully future classes, research, and community development projects.
- At the invitation of the Ministry of Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Rural Development of Haiti, Dr. Russell recently (summer 2017) led an exploration development team of seven faculty to explore opportunities for Purdue research and innovation expertise can contribute to improved infrastructure and self-sustaining food security, agriculture productivity, and environment preservation of Haiti. The Haiti deputy president and ministers visited Purdue in March 2018 to sign a MOU and launch an Inter-American Development Bank funded project. Follow up with the Faculty of AVM at the University de Haiti.
- Dr. Russell chaired a committee (2017-18) to revise the Purdue University College of Agriculture International Studies minor. This is a combination of language, international experiences, culture and history knowledge, and reflection on professional and personal growth.
- In 2016, Dr. Russell led an effort for the Purdue College of Agriculture to become a Global Partner in the Penn State Global Learning in Agricultural (#GLAG) online outreach program. This program has now grown in high schools across Indiana and compliments Purdue/Indiana's efforts with the Youth Global Food Institute in collaboration with the Global Food Prize program.
- Dr. Russell was on the formation team for the development and launching of the Purdue Peace Corp Prep (PCP) Program in 2014. This PCP program encourages students to broaden their horizons in their sector competencies along with language, intercultural and leadership attributes.
- In 2014, Dr. Russell was on the founding task force, which founded Purdue's Center for Intercultural Learning, Mentorship, Assessment, and Research (CILMAR) in International Programs. The with the mission to promote and assess curricular and co-curricular international learning options for Purdue students, faculty and staff while facilitating cutting edge research learning and assessment.
- In 2012, Dr. Russell and Dr. Terry Stewart establish a permanent exchange agreement between Purdue Agriculture and the Rural Sciences at the University of New England to provide pre-approved curricular alignment to facilitate the exchange of 6-10 student exchanges annually.
